Dear Parish Family,

It's been quite a quick moving 18 weeks since I've arrived as your new parish priest. In addition to the adjustments you have had to make with new priestly leadership, you have had to adjust to new pandemic procedures, new office hours, new weekday liturgy times, the return of the Sunday obligation, new staffers at all the major positions, and a new music team. That is a great amount of change in a small amount of time. I must say, I am quite impressed with the patience exercised by this flock thus far. I thank you for that.

As we continue to adjust to continued change I want to get ahead of a particular temptation common during transitions: gossip. With so much new, and so much unfamiliar it can be tempting to fill in our uncertainties with speculations, and then to spread those speculations among ourselves. Those speculations can then take a life of their own, and begin to do damage the truth, and even damage to reputations. This can cause dissension, dissatisfaction, and even disunity, if left unchecked by Christian virtue. Friendships can die, parishes can collapse, and families can be ruined due to gossip.

To best fight against this temptation is to practice Christian charity. So, if there is something new at the parish that you are concerned/confused about, take the following steps: Firstly, interpret the motive for the change in the most charitable way possible; assume the best motivation from the decision-maker. Next, bring up the concern with the individual who made it in a charitable way before bringing it up with anybody else save, perhaps, a spouse. More often than not, when communities practice this they come to greater understanding, and unity. The past may make us prone to assume malicious intentions, but if we start with the assumption of charity, we often find charity at the heart of decisions.

Finally, if you notice a conversation is going in the direction of gossip, a good way to stop it is to kindly ask the individuals if they have followed the protocol above. If it continues, it is best to kindly excuse yourself from that conversation.

I do sit in the captain's chair at this parish, so the changes do come with my approval. My Catholic dad taught me that a leader takes ownership of his decisions, and renders explanations to those who seek them. So please, if you have concerns about some of the changes, do reach out to me to discuss them. Email is the best way to make an appointment with me, but calling the office works as well.

This community of Christ has been quite remarkable these last 18 weeks. Let us be vigilant against the demons that attack in transition, and continue to be remarkable by the grace of the Holy Spirit.

May the God of love dwell in your hearts, and homes.
