Dear Parish Family,

I must say this parish has some stellar volunteers. I am most grateful for all the labor that is done to keep our buildings open, our people praying, and our spaces clean out of the goodness of generous hearts. I have come to understand that such volunteering is really what has kept this parish operating over the last several years, if not, decades. I wish to foster such volunteerism more, but I also need to balance that with the roles of our staff. So, below is a new parish policy effective immediately. Much of this deal with scheduling, so I'd like to offer a tip in such matters. After weekend Masses are NOT good times to get things scheduled with me or the staff as there is so much going on those days already, and our resources are not on hand. Office hours, however, lend themselves to such requests quite well.

St. Paul the Apostle Parish Policy

- Any temporary, or permanent removal, or altering of parish property for any purpose must be approved by the parish priest. Those who currently temporarily remove liturgical linens/vessels for cleaning, are considered to have this permission for that purpose at this time.
- If parish items are noticed to be in need of repair/cleaning, individuals are to inform the staff directly.
- Scheduling times with parish musicians and/or staff members to plan various events must be approved by the parish priest first.
- Volunteers and other parishioners are to ask their questions, or express their concerns pertaining to parish events or policies directly to the staff. They are not to use other volunteers or parishioners as intermediaries for such concerns or questions.
- All music concerns and questions are to be addressed to the parish priest, and NOT to the music staff.
- Any rescheduling/canceling of liturgies, or devotions in church buildings must be approved by the parish priest, or a staff member he has delegated to give such approval.
- No one is to answer questions, or otherwise speak on behalf of the parish priest, or staff members except for other staff members, or those to whom written permission to do so has been given by the parish priest.
- All questions pertaining to religious education must be referred to the parish office for official answers.
- The parish priest may be contacted directly via email, or indirectly through the parish staff. It is best to make the requests in writing, and the parish staff may require it.

March 19 is the Solemnity of St. Joseph, Husband of Mary. It happens to fall on a Lenten Friday this year.
