Dear Parish Family,

I am joyful to announce two upcoming happenings at our parish. For the first time in many, many years our community will host a parish mission. This is an event where an outside priest comes to a parish to delivery talks over several days. Fr. Christian Raab, OSB will do so the evenings of May 23-26 at 7pm in Ithaca. He will focus his talks on the Domestic Church (family life). I have known Fr. Christian for about 8 years. He is quite faithful, bright, and down to earth. Your time at any or all of his talks will be most worthwhile, especially since the talks will be followed by Eucharistic Adoration.

Next, we will host a St. Joseph the Worker Day at our Perrinton church on May 1st. The day will begin with Mass at 10:30am. Afterwards, Luke Cusack, our new buildings and grounds supervisor, will coordinate volunteers for various projects. Below is a list of items that we would gladly accept as donations to the parish and would be happy to assist with recording for tax purposes. If you choose to donate any of these items, please inform the parish office via email or phone so we can avoid surpluses. There is also a short list of projects we plan on taking on:

1. Replacing the bathroom floors with vinyl click lock flooring
2. Replacing the blinds in the cry room
3. Replacing the current railing on the ramp
4. Ripping out and replacing the border material on the flower bed in the back of church
5. A complete purge/reorganizing of closets and storage areas. Classrooms and Kitchen included.
6. Various painting projects.
7. Deep cleaning on kitchen/possible painting
8. Sound system tweaking
9. Door/window sealing and weather stripping

We will need tools for above jobs, N-95 masks, disposable gloves, paint, painting supplies, caps and railings (treated), Great Stuff, white exterior silicone, flooring, Simple Green, stone for north flower bed and edging, shop vacs, and trucks that could help us haul away debris. **PLEASE CONTACT THE OFFICE BEFORE PURCHASING.**
