READ TODAY'S DAILY READING HERE

Dear People of St. Paul Parish,

Let me take this opportunity to introduce myself. My name is Fr. Christian Raab, OSB. I am a Benedictine monk and priest from Saint Meinrad Archabbey in Southern Indiana. I am here for a couple weeks while Fr. Eddie gets a much-needed vacation. Travelling with me is Lexi O. Divina (Lexi for short), a German shepherd who is making her first trip away from Indiana!

This week I will be offering a parish mission. If you have never been to a parish mission, they are a time when the community gathers to reflect more deeply on a specific theme and gain more insight into what it means to live a faith filled life. The theme of this specific parish mission is Catholic home life, or what Vatican II called "the domestic Church." We will be exploring how to bridge the gap between what happens in Church and what happens in our households, whether we live alone or with a family.

Each evening (from Sunday through Wednesday) there will be a 20-30-minute talk beginning at 7 PM followed by the opportunity for adoration of the Blessed Sacrament until 8 p.m. Sunday's talk is entitled "The Home and the Monastery: Right Relationship in the Domestic Church." This talk will introduce the idea of the domestic Church and explore the perhaps unlikely topic of what households might learn from monasteries. Monday's talk will be a practical look at how to make one's home a place of prayer at all times of the liturgical year. Since this is the year of St. Joseph, Tuesday's focus will be on St. Joseph and what his example means for fathers. Wednesday's talk will focus on Mary as an image of missionary discipleship whose example teaches all Christians how to bring Christ into the world. Each evening is a stand-alone presentation so there is no problem if you attend some nights but not others. I look forward to spending this time with you all.
