READ TODAY'S DAILY READING HERE

Dear Parish Family,

This past Thursday (Sept. 9) the Church celebrated the Memorial of St. Peter Claver, a Jesuit missionary. In 1610 he left his native Spain for good to go and devote his life to the Gospel in the New World. He arrived in Cartagena, Columbia and was ordained a priest there in 1615. This particular town was a major hub for the 100 years old slave trade. 10,000 slaves a year would pass through this port, and upwards of 1/3 of all passengers on the slave ships died of disease or neglect. Despite the outcries of the popes, the trade continued. The saintly Peter Claver dedicated his priesthood, and entire being to the care of these most neglected persons. When the slaves were herded out of the ships like chained animals, Peter would move among them to distribute food, medicine, and most importantly, the message of Christ. He would, through translators, assure them of God's love, and of Christ's unity with them in suffering. It is estimated that he instructed or baptized upwards of 300,000 slaves.

Peter Claver lived among the most destitute to bring them Christ. He knew the slave trade was an entity too powerful for him to overthrow, so he did not focus his efforts on matters political, but rather spiritual. He directed his energies to bring these tortured souls to the foot of the tortured Christ and offer them eternity in heaven. Perhaps we feel powerless from time to time with unjust laws pervading our land. If we allow that to discourage us, we will not see the opportunity to serve those who suffer from such laws. We forget that the supreme law of the Church is the salvation of souls, and we too will overlook those we can introduce to the Christ. So, let us keep in mind this saint amidst the evils of this world, and be a light to those suffering from such evils.
