Dear Parish Family,

This past Tuesday (Oct. 12) was the memorial of a saint that is near and dear to my own heart, St. Edwin of Northumbria. He was born a pagan prince, and throughout his life struggled with the idea of converting to Christianity. He ascended to the rank of king and continued to contemplate the faith of Christ.

Through the work of St. Paulinus of York, Pope Boniface V, and Edwin's own wife he made the decision to become a Christian, and then opened the door to missionary activity in what would now be Northwest England, and Southern Scotland. The saintly king was instructed thoroughly in the faith by the aforementioned Paulinus (a disciple of St. Augustine) and insisted upon Paulinus stay with him in Northumbria to baptize his subjects. Many flocked to the font because of the piety, and fervor in which their king practiced his newfound faith. Edwin was known as being a wise man prior to his baptism, and then after receiving the graces of the sacraments became wise in his Christian faith as well. This is often how those with authority bring about the conversion of others. They exercise that authority with wisdom, strength, and enthusiasm. It is not just true as those with authority that rivals that of kings, but true for those who govern their own households as mothers and fathers.

St. Edwin is considered a martyr as he died in battle defending Northumbria against the pagan army of Mercia. His remains were immediately revered as relics and went to various churches in his kingdom including churches he had built. He is the patron saint of converts, kings, and those with large families.

It is good for us to know the stories of our patron saints, and it is important we name our children (at least a middle name) after saints, or heroic biblical figures. Trendy names will come and go, but the lives of saints speak to us forever, and give us examples of virtues to follow all through our lives. I ask all of you, when you keep me in prayer, to ask this Saintly king to pray for me.
